Thornton 2nd (Again) To Trojans

Thornton recorded a strong second place finish at the Moline Invitational track meet Saturday, but Coach Ed Fredette's Wildcats never had a chance against Steve Miller's awesome Bloom squad.

The Trojans scored 75 points to subdue a strong field that included Davenport (Iowa) Central (40), Rock Island (39), Moline (30), East Moline (22), Chicago Phillips (17) and Maine East (14).

Donald White and Lanell Gilbert were Thornton's winners. White turned in a 49.3 for 440 yards, 2 seconds behind the meet record set by another Thorntonite, Nick Bratcher.

GILBERT continued his improvement by throwing the shot 55-1. Curtis Cudjo was fourth at 53-5.

Bloom put together a powerful two mile relay that outdistanced Thornton by 25 yards, 7:54.0 to 7:58.3. Only Mitchell Johnston's 1:55.0 anchor leg was equal to the Trojan foursome of Dave Carrizales (2:01.6), Mark Lenke (1:58.0), Terry Bauer (1:58.6) and Jeff Small (1:55.8).

The mile relay produced a heart stopper between Thornton and Davenport Central. Mike Clark (52.3) and Bob Jackson (52.0) held a step lead before Central's third runner went past Steve Ibarra, despite his 50.9.

White, who had run out of the money in the 220 yard dash less than 10 minutes before, tried making up the three yard gap down the backstretch without success. Central won by inches as both teams clocked 3:24.9. White's split was 49.7.

ED TATE won the triple jump for Bloom with a 46-9 1/2. Thornton placed 2-3-5 with Brian Hewitt (44 1/2), Delwyn Horton (43-8 1/2) and Dan Bibbie (42-3). Tate took second in the long jump (20-10), behind Davenport's Bill Wiseman at 21-11 1/2. Tate had a 24-1 on a scratched attempt.

Bloom's Mike McCrindle took the pole vault at 14-0, with Thornton's Harvey Wesley (13-0) second.

Small and Johnston went 1-2 in the mile run. Small's 4:18.4 was more than Thornton's Johnston could handle at 4:19.5. Jackson placed second in the 330 yard low hurdles at 41.1, behind Moline's Ken Van Eckuate's 40.1.

Rock Island swept the 440 and 880 yard relays with times of 42.6 and 1:30.4. The Rocks' Jeff Lee also won the 100 yard dash in a respectable 9.8. Bloom's George Carter took the 220 in 22.1.

The Trojans' Gary Brown high jumped 6-8 for an easy win and narrowly missed at 6-9. Davenport's Mike Fuller won the 880 at 1:56.7 and Maine's Mark Tomasik prevailed at two miles with a 9:20.3. The 120 high hurdles went to Phillips' Claude Humbles in 14.5 and Maine's Mike

Thornton Runners Top H-F

Thornton turned in some noteworthy efforts in a 95-50 dual meet victory Tuesday at Homewood-Flossmoor, but was deprived of the chance to challenge Viking ace Ken Staggs one on one.

Staggs skipped the solo events, instead anchoring three H-F relay teams to respectable times for honor roll consideration.

The Vikings won the 440 and 880 relays in respective times of 44.9 and 1:33.5, but even with Staggs anchoring a solid 3:27.7, had to settle for second in the mile exchange.

THORNTON'S mile foursome of Mike Clark, Bob Jackson, Mitchell Johnston and Donald White teamed up for a 3:25.3 winning effort. The Wildcats also claimed the two-mile relay honors, with a clocking of 8:21.

Jackson was a double winner in the hurdles, covering the 120 highs in 15.9 and the 330 lows in 41.2.

Johnston won the 440 in 51.0, while White (1:58.8) and Clark (2:00.2) placed one-two in the Stagg-less 880 race.

Thornton picked up field event wins from Brian Hewitt (42-5 1/4) in the triple jump, Lanell Gilbert (53-7 1/4) in the shot put and Jay Wesley (12-0) in the pole vault.

Jeff Augustus turned in a sparkling distance double for the Vikings, winning the mile in 4:27.3 and the two-mile in 9:58.1. The Vikes won the sophomore meet by a score of 84-57.

Next up for Thornton is a trip to the Niles North invitational on Saturday and then another shot at powerful Bloom in a Tuesday dual meet at Chicago Heights.
